Dear Parents/Guardians

### **INFORMATION AND PROGRAMMES FOR TERM 2 2020**

Term 1 was a unique experience for all of us. We started the year with our Changkateers participating enthusiastically in various level-wide programmes, including residential camps, learning journeys to Post-Secondary Education Institutions, Student Leadership and Design Thinking workshops. Through these programmes, your child/ward stepped out of his/her comfort zone and experienced the joy of learning within a community. Friendships amongst students strengthened and teachers got an invaluable opportunity to get to know your child/ward better.

On 23 January, Singapore reported its first confirmed case of Covid-19. Shortly on 7 February, Singapore moved its disease outbreak response to code orange. Schools had to respond swiftly to ensure that schools remain a safe place for all students and staff. As a school, we demonstrated cohesion and psychological resilience by remaining calm and executing our duties with utmost responsibility to ensure the safety and well-being of all our Changkateers. I am proud that our Changkat Family has stood united and resolute through these trying times. School attendance has remained stable during this period and we do not take for granted the trust and confidence you have placed in the school.

As students return in Term 2, we will continue to be vigilant and timely in responding to the rapidly evolving situation. In addition to the national Stay Home Notice (SHN) regime, we will be instituting a 14-day Leave of Absence (LOA) for students and staff who have returned from overseas, regardless of country or mode of entry, on or after Saturday 14 March. This additional measure is put in place to further mitigate the chances of imported cases entering our school compounds. These students will be adequately supported through Home-Based Learning (HBL) and information on HBL provisions will be provided to affected parents. Additional social distancing measures will also be implemented for a period of two weeks in the first instance. This includes having fixed seating for students in the classrooms and canteen. Students will be required to wipe down their tables both in the classroom and in canteen daily. All CCAs and After School Programmes will also be suspended. We seek your partnership in educating your child/ward to continue practicing good personal hygiene and social responsibility.

At the same time, crisis is where we find precious opportunities to learn and grow. We seized teachable moments to educate our students (and ourselves) to live out the school's R3ICH values in this time of uncertainty and even disappointment as activities such as National School Games, which students had been training for, were suspended. During this period, where morning assemblies were held in the classrooms rather than the School Hall, we experimented with technology and were successful in streaming the Principal's address and even the Student Council Presidential Election Rally 'live' to all classrooms. Our School Management Team also put their creative talents together to produce a video to remind students on the right actions to take during this period. You can view the video at our Facebook page (https://www.facebook.com/changkateers/). One should never allow a crisis limit opportunities to learn and grow, and we certainly did not!

In the midst of this, our Changkateers would have completed their first milestone assessment for 2020. We will continue to work with your child/ward to give targeted feedback and support for his/her areas for improvement, as we encourage a growth mindset and work together towards continual





improvement. We have also put in place several structures such as target-setting and book/file checks to monitor their progress. Please do take a look at your child's/ward's subject files and contact us if you need further clarification. The role you play in guiding your child's/ward's development is important in helping him/her to learn and excel, and this is especially important for parents/guardians of students from the graduating classes. Through our conversations with parents during the respective Secondary 2 and 4 Parent-Teacher Conferences, we established a stronger partnership and we hope to continue this important collaboration to develop and support our children.

Term 2 promises to be an equally exciting and fruitful term as the pursuit of excellence and the holistic development of our children remains our priority. We look forward to your active engagement, and the key information under the following areas are for your attention:

## 1. Ensuring Safety and Security of Students

### 1.1 Daily Temperature-taking and Wipe-down Routines

As part of enhanced precautionary measures, daily visual screening and temperature taking will continue. As such, students should always have their Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT) with them in school. Students with fever (trigger temperature remains as 38.0 deg C) and/or display flu-like symptoms will be sent home. Students should seek medical attention and not to come to school if they are unwell. Students will also continue to wipe down the tables in the canteen after their recess and we will soon extend this routine to the classroom.

## 1.2 Building of Sheltered Walkway by Land Transport Authority (LTA)

We are pleased to inform you that LTA will soon commence work to build a sheltered walkway from Simei MRT to our school's front gate and that of Changkat Primary School. The project will commence in April 2020 and will be fully operational by May 2020. Do encourage your child/ward to take note of potential safety hazards in their journey to school while construction is taking place.

### 1.3 Road Safety

Parents/guardians are encouraged to constantly remind your child/ward on the importance of road safety inside and outside of the school. We seek your understanding to follow the correct traffic flow within the school compound and drop your child/ward only at the designated drop-off point at the foyer. If your child/ward is taking public transport, please also remind him/her to use the zebra crossings and designated footpaths when they are walking from the gate to the school building.

## 2 Developing Self Discipline and Responsibility

### 2.1 Punctuality to School

Please encourage your child/ward to plan his/her journey well, and be in the school by 8.25 a.m. on Mondays and 7.30 a.m. on Tuesdays to Fridays. This will inculcate the habit of punctuality and ensure that there is no loss of curriculum time due to late-coming.





#### 2.2 Absenteeism

The school places great emphasis on student learning and hence strongly discourages frequent absenteeism as such behaviour disrupts the child's learning and affects his/her performance. Parents/guardians should monitor your child's/ward's attendance closely, and ensure he/she does not stay away from school. Absenteeism must be substantiated with medical certificates only. Students who are absent without valid reasons will face disciplinary consequences. Should you need any assistance, please approach the school and we can work out a plan for your child/ward.

## 2.3 Attire and Grooming

In response to students' requests to wear the school's House T-shirt for school due to the hot weather, the school has given permission for students to do so from Monday to Thursday. However all students are reminded that school tops and House T-shirts must have nametags sewn on as stated in our student handbook. Failure to do so may result in the need for disciplinary action.

#### 2.4 CCA Stand Down for 4E/5N/4NA

All Sec 4E/5N/4NA students will stand down from their CCAs from 13 April. This is to provide the right signaling and conducive environment to allow our graduating students to prepare for the upcoming national examinations.

### 3.1 Computer Ownership for Students under MOE Financial Assistance Scheme (FAS)

All Secondary students who are under the MOE FAS are strongly encouraged to purchase a computer, complete with Internet connection. ## Step 1 - SingPass Registration and 2FA Setup
